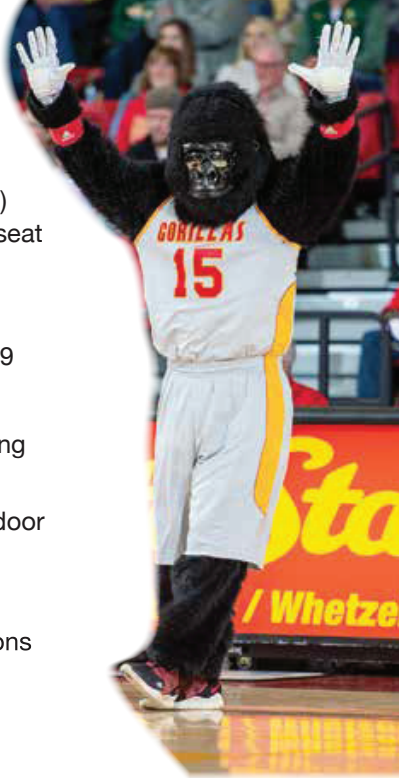

KANSAS AND OUT-OF-STATE FRESHMEN UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE

For automatic admission, graduates from an accredited high school must meet the following:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.25+ OR ACT score of 21+ for incoming freshmen.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

(A transfer student is defined as a student with 24 or more transferable college credit hours earned after high school graduation.)

For automatic admission, a transfer student must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale in all college coursework.

There are provisions for a small number of exceptions to the admission standards. Please contact the Admission Office for more information.

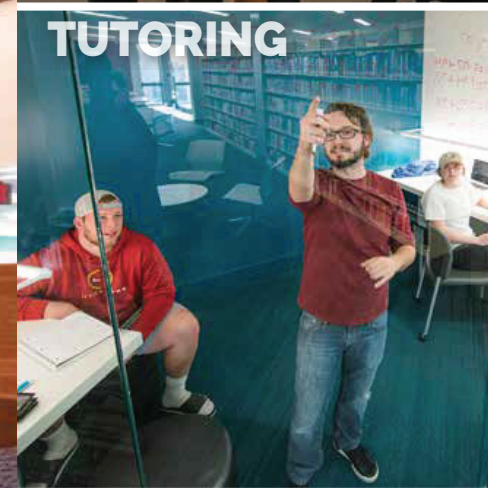

FAQ's

I am in high school and taking college courses. Am I considered a transfer student?

No. In order to be considered a transfer student, a student must have completed at least 24 credit hours of college-level course work after high school graduation.

How will my college credits transfer?

Most academic course work will be accepted by PSU if the credit was earned from a regionally accredited two-year or four-year college or university. Course equivalency information is available for many institutions at pittstate.edu/admission.

Does PSU accept AP (Advanced Placement) or IB (International Baccalaureate) Credit?

Students completing the AP exam with scores of 5, 4 or 3 may receive appropriate credit. Pittsburg State recognizes the IB Diploma Program and awards advanced standing credit for specific scores on the higher level examinations. Visit pittstate.edu/registrar for additional details.

Will PSU accept military credit?

Advanced standing credits, as noted on the student's military transcript, will be given to veterans for formal service school courses on the basis of the American Council of Education (ACE).

Do I have to have an associate degree to transfer?

No, you can transfer anytime as long as you meet transfer admissions requirements.

Do I have to send all my college transcripts?

Yes. In order for PSU to determine whether you meet admission requirements, we must evaluate your entire academic history including course work completed at each institution attended.

Tuition and Fees

Flat rate tuition and special tuition break programs make Pitt State very affordable. And, at PSU, student fees – such as your Gorilla ID card, event tickets, student health center and recreation center access, and parking – are included in tuition costs. The following is an example of the expenses for a full-time undergraduate student living in a residence hall for the 2020-2021 academic year:

Tuition Breaks

The Gorilla Advantage

In-state tuition for students in Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Tennessee, and Texas.

The Gorilla Edge

150% of in-state tuition for students in Colorado, Iowa, Nebraska, and Texas.

Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP)

150% of in-state tuition for students in Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota, Ohio and Wisconsin.

Pitt State Legacy Program

150% of in-state tuition for students with a parent or grandparent who graduated from PSU. Students who have a friend or family member interested in attending PSU may also qualify for the tuition break under the Gorilla Companion Plan.



Financial Aid

Student Financial Assistance, Scholarships & Student Employment

Scholarships, grants, student loans and work-study are important ways to help finance a college education. Student employment can also be a rewarding way to earn financial support.

ADMISSION SCHOLARSHIPS*

The application for admission and scholarships must be completed and submitted along with all required transcripts and additional documentation by February 1 (or December 15 for transfer students starting in the spring semester) to be eligible for Admission Scholarships. Admission Scholarships will be awarded contingent upon funding. (Self-reported information is not accepted for scholarship purposes).

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) beginning Oct. 1 for each academic year (PSU Code 001926) at fafsa.gov. Priority deadline is Feb. 1.

FAQ's

FINANCIAL AID

What happens after I submit the FAFSA? You will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) within 3-5 days. If additional information or documentation is needed to support your FAFSA, you will be notified. Information and updates regarding your FAFSA will be emailed to you, so be sure to check your email frequently.

Is there a deadline? The priority deadline for filing the FAFSA is March 1, but you are encouraged to file beginning Oct. 1.

How will I be notified of my FAFSA awards? You will be notified via email of how to review and accept your awards electronically.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Is there a deadline? The deadline is Feb. 1. Students who apply after Feb. 1 will be considered as funds remain available. The deadline for the Honors College application is Jan. 15.

How will I be notified? Most scholarship recipients will be contacted by mail by April 1.

Are family finances considered? Most scholarships are awarded on a merit basis. Some scholarships include financial need as a requirement.

Are scholarships renewable? Some are and some are not. You must reapply each year.

The Student Employment Office assists students enrolled at PSU in finding part-time employment and internship opportunities on- or off-campus. Most positions pay minimum wage (\$7.25 per hour) and are limited to 20 hours a week. Common positions include: office & lab assistant, cashier, tutor, data entry operator and web page designer.
