Program and Outreach Coordinator Updates

Business Studies/ Student Engagement – Holly Kent

Dr. Binder developed a matrix outlining all possible combinations of minors and minors with certificates. These combinations were then narrowed down based on the program requirement of 21 unique upper-level course credits and which combinations were most logical. This information will support our academic advisors in addressing student inquiries about the Business Studies Major. A total of 17 combinations were identified. Thanks Alex! Data Science Information Systems – Wei Sha

Here are several events DSIS faculty is working on:

- 1. Creating a data science emphasis for our MBA program: DSIS faculty is working with Chelsey to create a data science emphasis for our MBA program. A general consensus is that setting up this emphasis for the PMBA program should be a priority. The proposed classes include data visualization, database management and predictive analytics. The discussions on an emphasis for our traditional MBA program are still ongoing.
- 2. Discussed the programming courses with colleagues in Computer Science. Dr. Grimes paid for a lunch with CS colleagues, and Dr. Sikolia attended. This could be an opportunity for DSIS to further improve our course offerings.
- 3. Data analytics club currently has 14 members. Charlotte Cox, past CIS graduate and current assistant vice president at U.S. Bank, will speak with the club on October 1st.
- 4. Sang approached me about helping with an exchange program student from Korea. Further discussions are needed.
- 5. Dwight was contacted by an external party about analyzing data for business insights. Waiting for further developments.

The Finance Club renewed activities in early September and elected officers and scheduled fund raising at Pitt State Football games as in the past.

Management – Sang Lee

The first 2+2 student from Woosong University in South Korea has finally arrived! He is pursuing a dual degree in Computer Science while here at Pitt State and is interested in taking some DSIS courses as well. In response to his inquiry, I am collaborating with DSIS to explore the possibility of a double major or minor in DSIS for this student. He mentioned that he is really enjoying the classes and the community here. He has already started speaking positively about Pitt State to peers at his home university. I hope more students, especially those majoring in business, will join us soon.

Before the pandemic, we had a group of management students from our partner school in South Korea, SeoulTech, participate in our summer programs for a couple of years. They are now planning to resume the summer program. As a reciprocal arrangement, the university has reserved one or two spots for Pitt State students in their summer program, subject to yearly availability. This is a free-of-charge, two-week language and culture program that includes accommodations, activity fees, transportation, meals, and airport pick-up/drop-off. Priority will be given to students majoring in Management or other programs within the Kelce College of Business.

JMI is seeking quality research papers. JMI is an interdisciplinary, quarterly peer-reviewed journal listed in Scopus, ABDC, and other indices. The journal is receiving a good number of submissions but aims to publish even higher-quality papers. Hopefully, our Kelce colleagues can submit their articles or spread the word within their networks. I am working on obtaining the DOIs for the published papers and the journal's IF (impact factor).

Not too much going on in Marketing. I believe Lynn will give the update on the Marketing Instructor position search. Other than that, we have a faculty meeting on Wednesday, October 2, at Drop the H. We will discuss items on our marketing agenda but will also use it as a social/team building activity. Dr. Frank also gave me an update on the Student Marketing Association. Internship Center Milestones/Accomplishments

- Since 8/15/24, we've had around 50 visits/calls/emails to the internship center about 10 of those were repeat visitors, about 10 were employers looking to set-up internships.
- The new Meet the Firms event was successful overall attendance was still down, but Career Development, students, and employers enjoyed the new location.

- The internship center has successfully helped around 10 employers post internships and micro internships. About \$8,000 of the grant funds through Parker Dewy has been utilized by local employers to hire Pitt State KCOB interns.
- The Internship Handbook is stylized and finalized. The first copy has been printed with the help of Mimi on 11x17 paper. We hope to have copies available by the end of September to distribute to faculty, staff, advisors, students, and employers.
- We are working on selecting a certificate template so we can present KCOB Interns (internship for credit) with an official certificate at the internship reception.
- We've also started work on an internal marketing campaign we've termed "I am a KCOB Intern," or "I am an Intern." We hope to have this ready by the end of this semester.
- I am working with Kait to share/coordinate information each semester to make sure she has access to all Kelce Interns for any reports that might need to be submitted.
