I. Dean's Administrative Update

- a. Provost's Academic Leadership Council met yesterday
 - 1. A&S and CCOT Deans Searches candidate visits for both searches to be held starting first week of Spring 2025 semester; COE and Library interims will remain in place through end of Spring 2025
 - 2. Long discussion on Meet & Confer process; determining administrative priorities for bargaining with KNEA
 - 3. Gorilla Plan; President Shipp expressed concern about no new initiatives for colleges; communication issues as AA units were instructed to write 2-year initiatives
 - 4. Deans asked to provide priorities to Susan to share with Development Staff; Faculty, Programs, Facilities, and Scholarships
- b. Economic Outlook Conference in cooperation with Wichita State; later this morning in OSC (10:30 a.m.)
- c. KBOA Fall Meeting on Friday will finalize agenda on Wednesday; focus on building and curriculum
- d. KCOB Credit Hour Generation discuss table distributed earlier and attached; used for staffing request; discussed inequities in faculty load across campus
- II. Administrative Area Updates
 - a. ADGPB Chelsey: catching up on emails; WF2 PMBA session began on Monday; had GA meeting with Holly and Kait last week and discussed new processes for hiring GAs; looking for someone to teach ACCTG 814 in the PMBA in the spring; scheduling class visits for MBA/PMBA/GA recruiting; discussed if there is a policy on missing class to go home and vote – will need to; discussed need to align the undergraduate business administration minor with the MBA prerequisite list and the MBA admissions criteria – make it seamless for bus admin minors to be admitted to the MBA program – will visit this next KLT meeting
 - b. ADMIN Mimi: distributed thank you notes from late scholarship recipients; discussed meeting with Kelce admins last week will distribute new list of duties
 - c. ADUSB Lynn: no report
 - d. DSES Holly: Dr. Sha will come to Academic Advisor meeting this week to talk about DSIS; prepared feedback for faculty to address concerns with GA's; working on the new Kelce mentoring program ("Bridge"?) to be piloted in the spring semester; serving on committee to review curriculum for Gorilla Gateway course content and will then meet with faculty in Kelce who teach the course; just had Business Professionalism luncheon discussed having a course fee to support these lunches and other events; fall career fair is this Thursday in the Student Center
 - f. FC Alex: yesterday was deadline to submit legislation for FS meeting in December; prepared flow chart of undergraduate legislation processes GA will work on designing a formal document; need to prepare curriculum updates for the university catalog will inactivate CIS courses, add new HRD major and courses, and minors need to be described better; also, need to add internship courses to official program curriculum listings for those majors and minors where they do not already appear will ask PC's to review their programs in the catalog for any additional issues that we can clean up; HPSS has approached us about using several KCOB courses for an undergraduate Public Policy minor Alex will work with them to narrow down the best list

 - 1. Human Resource Development BBA and MS task force has met and found some good solutions; new BBA proposal submitted to legislation
 - 2. Supply Chain Management BBA (in cooperation with CCOT's BS in Industrial Distribution) has been entered into legislation; we assume that CCOT has done the same

- 3. Entrepreneurship Minor within Management BBA will be submitted within the next couple of weeks for legislation; does not need KBOR approval if minor is offered under the Management program
- 4. Business Education pathway within Business Studies BBA Education has to notify teaching council that pathway is forthcoming before we can submit for legislation
- 5. Regional Economic Development emphasis for MBA HPSS faculty and Professor Davidsson are working on new syllabi for proposed courses

 - Assistant Instructional Professor of Marketing (NTE) candidate visit last week; discuss options and impact; committee recommends offering the position to the candidate; on long-term staffing needs; concerns with temporary nature of the position; candidate is aware but college will seek to turn it in to long-term as retirements and departures likely to occur (salary pool and earning available as stop gap if necessary)
