- I. Administrative

 1. Rumble in the Jungle this Saturday, October 8th

 - ii. 1,500 people anticipated to attend with 600 students in attendance.
 - iii. Student organization fair will be going on in conjunction with the Rumble.
 2. Economic Outlook Conference with Wichita State next Tuesday, October 11th
 - i. Dr. Grimes is waiting on the script from WSU
 - ii. Recruiting students to attend (Myles & Rigo, so far)

 - i. Beautiful day for the tournament and all went well
 - ii. 2022-2023 Kelce Golf Tournament scholarship recipient attended and spoke (Zelpha Estes)
 4. Preparations for KBOA meeting; agenda items?

 - ii. Friday’s meeting will begin at noon at the University house
 - iii. Would like the President to discuss Plan B for building project with the board and hopefully get input from board members

- II. Presidential Transition
 - a. Debrief TAC meetings from Din and Chelsey
 1. Big concerns with enrollment
 2. Much of the focus in the meetings has been on needing to be creative in getting enrollment numbers up (Business Studies was used as a positive example); PMBA program was highlighted as helping to grow enrollment and university revenues
 3. Tuition rate comparison among MIAA schools was discussed. Pitt State is the 4th from the bottom.
 4. Credentialing
 5. Recruitment aspect of enrollment – some really good students not being targeted in recruiting. Need to find new ways to recruit. KLT discussed E-Campus model at Eastern Kentucky University.

 - a. Debrief MABDA meeting
