Kelce Leadership Team Retreat Meeting

- I. PLC Updates
 - a. Strategic Visioning – rpk Group visit
 - i. Dr. Grimes met with the PLC group that met with the rpk group today in the Student Center. Process designed to produce very positive changes at Pitt State.
 1. Transformations will be up to Pitt State to make, rpk will be a facilitator only.
 2. Looking at a 90 day turn around schedule on initiatives.
 - a. Dr. Grimes asked for input from KLT on any initiatives that have a return for Kelce. What can be done out of the box that will provide a positive return?
 - b. Professional on-line MBA can be used as a good model for these initiatives.
 - b. Summer Innovation Grants redirected to direct recruitment efforts; funding transferred to college OOE accounts for use and distribution; KCOB received \$3,093; how to allocate?
 - i. Proposals from faculty were below expectations so funds have been distributed to colleges for recruitment efforts within the colleges/departments.
 1. Suggested to use funds for recruiting materials that are being planned.
 2. KLT were asked to provide additional input on spending allocated funds.
 - a. Suggestion was made to use some of the funds for participation with FBLA.
 - b. Find a way to create programs to bring high school students to campus.

 - i. AACSB reaffirmation will be officially announced.

 - a. discussed having committee chairs give regular committee reports at faculty meetings – we have not been strict on this over past several years
