

PSU Course Description: An in-depth study of leadership, organizational design and the interactions between individuals, groups and organizations. Emphasis will be given to an experiential exercise in leadership and team-building. Other topics include organizational behavior, motivation, HRM, and other management processes.

Prerequisite: Students are required to have completed an undergraduate degree and be admitted to the Online Professional M.B.A. program.

Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes

At the end of this course, you should be able to:

- 1. Recognize and explain the responsibilities of and relationship between leaders and followers.
- 2. Identify organizational design and recognize its effect on leadership.
- 3. Compare and contrast being a leader versus being a manager.
- 4. Recognize basic leadership models and theories.
- 5. Apply concepts and theories of leadership to different situations.
- 6. Develop one's personal leadership style and strengths.

Course Outline

There are seven weekly modules to the course. Each module will be available to you on the Sunday prior to the week's start; thus, students cannot work ahead. Two chapters of the text will be covered in each module. There will be a quiz (covering two chapters), homework assignment, and discussion



board for each weekly module. Everything needed for the week will be found in the module, so please don't look outside of the module for assignments. Students will have two attempts at the quizzes, with the highest score being counted. All quizzes are open book/note. *You must use Respondus LockDown Browser for testing.* Technical difficulties should be directed to campus support, namely Gorilla Geeks, 620-235-4600.
