Modern Languages Major for Native Speakers of French or Spanish

Catalog description

Native speakers are encouraged to take courses in French or Spanish. Students who graduated from high school in a French- or Spanish-speaking country may fulfill coursework for a major in Modern Languages by completing 15 hours of upper division courses in the native language, French or Spanish. Native speakers of any language taught in the department are not allowed to enroll in lower-division courses in that language. Consult with the chairperson of the department or the Modern Languages Program coordinator.

Process to declare a Native Speaker Major:

Contact the chair of the English and Modern Languages Department, providing the name, student ID#, and native speaker language (French or Spanish). The chair will contact the Degree Checking office to report that a student qualifies for this Program. Then, chair / faculty will direct the student to the Degree Checking office, 102 Russ, to apply for the official degree check. The Degree Checking office will not add anyone to this Program without the direct approval of the chair of the English and Modern Languages Department.
